PRESIDENT



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West Virginia Northern Community College, a public, tri-campus, comprehensive, two-year college, seeks a dynamic, visionary leader with significant post-secondary education and training, community college, and senior administrative experience to serve as President. Committed to advancing the institution to even higher levels of achievement, this executive officer will embrace and passionately articulate our mission of providing learning opportunities that enrich the lives of individuals and promote the economic growth of the region and the state.

The new President is expected to join the College in late summer 2026.



THE COLLEGE

The West Virginia Board of Regents established West Virginia Northern Community College (Northern) in 1972, by re-designating the former Hancock County Branch and the Wheeling Campus of West Liberty State College (now known as West Liberty University). The Board specified that the newly created dual-campus community college would be responsible for providing educational programs of two years or less duration for high school graduates and adults. Responding to local community needs, the College began offering courses in New Martinsville in 1973, establishing its third campus there in 1975.

In the 2024-25 academic year, Northern enrolled 2,480 credit students plus 852 non-credit workforce students across its three campuses in Wheeling, Weirton, and New Martinsville. Students are primarily from the Northern Panhandle region of West Virginia, with approximately 16 percent attending from out of state.

Northern's tuition is among the lowest in West Virginia. In addition to affordable in-state tuition, Northern has a tuition reciprocity agreement with the State of Ohio that provides students from either state with in-state tuition rates. A lower "metro rate" is also provided to students in adjacent counties in Pennsylvania.

COLLEGE MISSION STATEMENT

West Virginia Northern is a comprehensive community college that provides affordable, quality education and training for all who wish to learn. Northern strengthens our community and empowers individuals to pursue fulfilling lives.

With its open enrollment policy, Northern admits all students seeking postsecondary education. Northern also has a robust dual enrollment program with high school partnerships across the Northern Panhandle, including the West Virginia Level-Up Pathways program in which career-technical students earn college credit for high school courses aligned with degree programs at Northern. Currently, dual enrollment students comprise over 30 percent of Northern's total credit headcount.

The College has 55 full-time and 100 part-time adjunct faculty, providing a 12-to-1 student-faculty ratio. Faculty bring both knowledge and real-world experience to their classrooms, as well as a strong commitment to student success.

THE COLLEGE (CONT.)

As a comprehensive community college, Northern provides 71 programs and courses in applied technology, business, career studies, computer information technology, culinary arts, education, healthcare, human services, criminal justice, and liberal arts. Workforce development is a key part of the mission and includes dozens of non-credit continuing education offerings. The College awards the Associate in Arts (AA), Science (AS) and Applied Science (AAS) degrees including nearly 20 specialized 2+2 transfer programs with numerous four-year institutions. Online courses and enrollments continue to expand currently comprising approximately 30 percent of total credit course offerings and enrollments.

At the May 2025 Commencement ceremony, Northern awarded 240 degrees and certificates to 214 students. The College's Radiography program pass rate on the national licensure exam was 100 percent, with Northern's students consistently scoring above state and national averages. In addition, students in Nursing, Surgical Technology, Medical Lab Technology, and Health Information Technology programs all achieved 90 percent or higher success rates on licensure exams. Ten academic programs have specialized program accreditation from national accrediting agencies.

Students are engaged on campus and in the community. Student government, academic honor organizations, academic program clubs, intramural/club sports including eSports, and special interest groups are active at the College. The Office of Student Engagement offers a number of community service opportunities and events

that both engage students in community experiences and raise funds and donations to support students and for community causes.

The College has an active Foundation that raises funds to support student scholarships, emergency assistance, facility upgrades, and student success initiatives. The WVNCC Foundation Board is comprised of 25 community members from diverse backgrounds. Current assets exceed \$10 million. The Foundation recently received its largest private donation to date, a \$650K planned gift from a former faculty member.

Significant multi-year federal and state grants and programs currently underway include:

- TRIO/Upward Bound – US Department of Education, \$300K, awarded annually.
- HEA Title III – US Department of Education, \$1.2M, Year 4 of 4.
- Rural Guided Pathways – National Center for Inquiry and Improvement, one of 16 first round colleges, Year 4 of 6.
- Manufacturing and Production Skills 2.0 – US Department of Labor, \$1.5M, Year 2 of 4.
- WV Advance Grant for Respiratory Therapy – WV Community and Technical College System, \$250K, Year 2 of 3.

A good listener with a sense of humor, this executive administrator will be approachable and able to engage people at all levels. This leader will be an advocate for the College, our students, faculty and staff, and will seek common ground when there are diverse viewpoints.

Candidates should have the academic and administrative leadership experience to successfully accomplish the responsibilities and goals of the position. An earned doctoral degree from a regionally accredited institution is strongly preferred.

- The ability to foster a vibrant and empowered community through a proven leadership style that evokes trust, welcomes collaboration, reflects confident decision making, and effectively engages the talents and experiences of employees
- Highest standards of personal and professional integrity and credibility
- Effective communication skills, both oral and written, especially in articulating the College's mission, vision and goals
- Successful financial leadership experience that demonstrates resourceful approaches to handling a complex operating budget
- Proven track record of collaborating with local and regional employers to address workforce skill needs to include both credit and workforce learning solutions
- The knowledge and ability to be effective within a state political system, including interacting with elected and appointed officials, agencies, and boards
- The ability to lead collaboratively in a manner that provides a supportive, responsive working and learning environment for faculty, staff, and students
- A leadership style that enhances the relationship of the College to other educational institutions and the broader local and state community
- The ability to strategically position the College to achieve future success

Serving three campuses, Northern's administrative offices are located in the historic B&O Building, originally the passenger terminal of the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad, in the City of Wheeling. Known as "the friendly city," Wheeling and the surrounding area has a unique, rich, and historic heritage. The city has a population of 27,052, while the metro area has more than 140,000 residents.
