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ABOUT WAYNE STATE COLLEGE

In 1891, Wayne State was founded as a Normal School, a teacher's college, became a state school in 1910, and was renamed Wayne State College by the Nebraska legislature in 1963. We have become a leading comprehensive college in Northeast Nebraska, with 15 academic departments within four academic schools and more than 130 career pathways.

Our newest undergraduate programs include engineering technology, accelerated nursing, and pre-public health. New master's programs include human performance and wellness management, criminal justice administration, and interdisciplinary studies.

Wayne State offers more than 100 clubs and organizations in areas of academics, government, recreation and sport, religion, service, special interests, and social programs. Students are encouraged to join activities, clubs, and organizations that appeal to their interests. Club sports are incredibly popular, with many teams earning high ranks at regional and conference tournaments, and later advancing to compete and place on a national level. WSC's newest club sports include esports, women's volleyball, wrestling, and disc golf. Athletics have enjoyed a rich tradition of success and been an important part of the College since 1912. The College offers six men's sports and nine women's sports at the NCAA Division II level.

Wayne State College serves as a model of success for regional public higher education. Investments in infrastructure and facilities, expanded academic programs and partnerships, a campus-wide approach to recruitment and retention, and a commitment to strategic planning have yielded 28% growth in enrollment during the past six years, soaring to more than 4,500 students.

ABOUT WAYNE STATE COLLEGE (CONT.)

Wayne State's cost of attendance is among the lowest in the Midwest among four-year colleges and universities. Our aggressive work to keep costs down while leveraging scholarships and aid have resulted in the average indebtedness for graduates decreasing each year for the past four years, from \$23,599 to \$18,088, while the percentage of students graduating with zero debt has grown to 35% from 31% during the same period.

Students learn from accomplished faculty. Several are highly regarded as experts in their discipline and have been recognized with notable honors and awards. With a 20:1 student-to-faculty ratio, students receive an excellent education in a personalized setting and 86% of faculty hold the highest degrees in their fields.

The College's momentum is sustained by a data-driven blueprint that aims to inspire students, strengthen communities, and serve our region. Our goals are clear: continually improve retention and graduation rates; provide high-quality academic programs and campus facilities; support workforce and economic development in the region; maintain affordability and access; and manage resources for sustainability.

Our physical campus is beautiful and well-positioned to meet our needs. Careful planning and stewardship have brought about a newly built Center for Applied Technology, several completely renovated residence halls, academic buildings, and athletic facilities, and an inviting Campus Commons area at the center of a 128-acre campus that speaks directly to visitors about the pride we have in our history and traditions. The campus will open its first new residence hall in 57 years, scheduled for the Spring of 2025. Also underway is a new athletic and recreation center. Since 2017, campus investments total more than \$90 million.

Alongside our commitment to the physical campus, the College's vision, mission, and core values precisely define our highest aspirations, our commitment to the students we educate, and the guidance we have set for ourselves and our important work.

We are passionate, committed, and dedicated to helping our students fulfill their dream of earning a Wayne State College degree. The institution's core values around diversity, engaged learning, sustainability, innovation and agility, partnerships, and culture and community guide the strategies and the execution of the mission while serving as the foundation for Wayne State's work.

PRESIDENT MARYSZ RAMES

Dr. Marysz Rames was appointed the 13th president of Wayne State College in 2015. Her tenure has been marked by a strong focus on the future of the College's academic programs, partnerships, strategic enrollment planning, fundraising, raising the College's visibility, and constructing and renovating facilities to enhance student learning. Under President Rames' leadership, Wayne State's total enrollment has increased by 20% and academic programs have grown from 90 to 130 with a focus on degrees that align with the region's economic development needs. Additionally, there has been a focus on building relationships and solidifying partnerships with business and community leaders, University of Nebraska system, community colleges, and school districts to provide students with seamless pathways to reaching their educational goals.

Dr. Rames earned her doctorate in adult and higher education from the University of South Dakota. She earned her bachelor of science degree in business administration and communication studies, with a minor in economics, and her master's degree in educational administration from University of Northern Colorado.

She came to Wayne State from Dakota State University in S.D., where she had served as interim president since August 2014. Prior to her interim appointment, Dr. Rames served as the vice president for student affairs from 2000 to 2015 at South Dakota State University.







LEADERSHIP AGENDA

Wayne State College's next Vice President for Academic Affairs will be an essential partner in a forward-thinking institution with students as the primary focus. Working collaboratively with President Marysz Rames and her leadership team, the VPAA will engage faculty and other campus constituents to build on strengths and envision new innovative programming and modes of instruction for current and new student populations.

The VPAA supervises the Associate Vice President of Academic Affairs; Deans of the Schools of Arts and Humanities, Business and Technology, Education and Behavioral Sciences, and Science, Health, and Criminal Justice; Assistant to the VPAA; Director of the Learning Center; Graduate Program Coordinator; Library Director; Assessment Director; Service Learning Coordinator; Director of the Center for Faculty Development and Innovation; and Academic Affairs Project Coordinator.

Major leadership agenda priorities include:

1. Creating environments that provide academic leadership, supervision, and management.

- Responsible for the successful operation of all academic areas at the College. Serve as an advocate for academic affairs with internal and external stakeholders.
- Develop an efficient process for developing and implementing academically-sound programs, which includes building a positive working relationship with the State College System office.
- Oversee and engage faculty in developing, evaluating, assessing, and revising curricula that supports student achievement.
- Ensure compliance with the Higher Learning Commission and work with the Deans regarding the accreditation of programs specific areas.
- Recruit and recommend to the President, with the advice of deans and college standing committees, appropriate faculty decisions such as appointments, salary, retention, promotion, tenure, and grievances and disciplinary actions.
- Participate in the negotiation of contracts for faculty and academic support personnel.

- Work with academic deans to create and implement a faculty development agenda to meet the needs of faculty and program objectives.
- Monitor existing, emerging, and innovative technologies to improve teaching and learning as well as make appropriate recommendations for implementing such technology.
- Support and guide a robust continuing education program that includes online courses, hybrids, and offsite delivery.
- Ensure compliance with College and Board policies and procedures.
- Embrace the college-wide commitment to shared governance by working collaboratively with the Faculty, Support Staff, Professional Staff, and Student Senates.
- Create environments that promote the professional success and well-being of academic support staff, academic deans, department chairs, and directors who comprise the Office of Academic Affairs.
- Promote partnerships with off-campus constituencies that enhance College and regional effectiveness which includes developing articulation agreements with other colleges and universities.

2. Advance Scholarly Activity and Service

- Enhance, promote, and support quality scholarly activity and service learning.
- Work with academic deans to clarify and promote the role that faculty scholarly activity plays throughout the College to support the achievement of institutional objectives.
- Encourage and facilitate pursuit of external funding, grants and contracts, and other resources that sustain scholarship and regional economic development.

3. Support Student Success and Engagement

- Create and support a campus environment that celebrates a wide spectrum of perspectives, fostering an atmosphere of acceptance and collaboration.
- Create and maintain a strong international education program.

- Support NCAA Division II athletics and student life.
- Collaborate with the Vice President of Student Affairs to develop, implement, and monitor a student success model that is strategic and data driven.
- Provide academic input and support to the institutional undergraduate enrollment management efforts.
- Create, implement, and manage a robust Graduate Student Enrollment Management Plan.

4. Provide Institutional Leadership, Planning, and Budgeting

- Support and participate in institutional governance and committee structure.
- Represent Wayne State College's academic programs to external organizations, groups, and individuals to promote and develop support for the College's mission, vision, and goals.
- Collaborate with the President and Deans to identify priorities, and subsequently partner with the Chief Executive Officer of the Wayne State Foundation to secure philanthropic support for Wayne State College.
- Formulate and articulate sound policies and demonstrated ability to identify, resolve, and consult on a wide range of administrative and personnel issues with a clear sense of institutional needs and priorities.
- Ensure effective and transparent communication with constituents across the institution.



- Build collaborative relationships with the campus community and external stakeholders.
- Work with the other executive officers on development of the campus master plan, campus wide facilities planning efforts, and physical plant functions.
- Oversee development and implementation of academic strategic planning.
- Supervise the preparation and submission of annual budgets for areas of direct responsibility to ensure appropriate resource allocation to advance strategic priorities. Plan for long-term capital and operational resource needs; manage and monitor budgets on an ongoing basis.
