This includes leveraging data to inform decisions, aligning academic programs with workforce needs, and fostering a culture of innovation and continuous improvement. The ideal candidate will be a high-energy change agent with a demonstrated ability to lead strategic transformation, tackle complex issues with urgency, and build trust across diverse constituencies.



ABOUT THE CITY UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK

The City University of New York (CUNY) is the nation's largest urban public university, a transformative engine of social mobility that is a critical component of the lifeblood of New York City. ABOUT BOROUGH OF MANHATTAN COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Founded in 1963, BMCC is a vibrant teaching and learning community committed to advancing the intellectual and personal growth of our students. With an enrollment of more than 21,000 degree-seeking and 10,000 workforce development/continuing education students supported by over 550 full-time faculty and over 1,020 adjunct faculty, across 19 academic departments. BMCC is the largest undergraduate college within the City University of New York (CUNY) system.

An educational leader, BMCC was selected from 1,000 community colleges nationwide to be included among 150 community colleges eligible to compete for the \$1 million 2025 Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence, the nation's signature recognition of high achievement and performance among community colleges. The Aspen Prize is awarded every two years. In 2021, BMCC was named one of the Aspen Award's Top Ten finalists.

Recent retention and graduation rates are as follows: 61% one-year retention rate for a full-time, first-time student cohort (Fa2023), and 25% three-year graduation rate for a full-time, first-time student cohort (Fa2021).

The Niche Best Community Colleges in America ranking named BMCC the number one community college in New York State in both 2025 and 2026. Additionally, a 2020 report from the Brookings Institute placed BMCC third among all two-year colleges in the nation for its success in helping low-income students move into the middle class. Additionally, BMCC was ranked as a Top Two Year Hispanic Serving College for 2025 by the Washington Monthly College Guide.

BMCC is ranked among the top community colleges in the nation, according to Community College Week and the U.S. Department of Education. Students choose from more than 50 academic programs in STEM, business management, criminal justice, nursing and other areas of study that transfer easily to bachelor degree programs or propel them into successful careers. The institution offers Associate degrees in Applied Sciences (A.A.S.), Arts (A.A.), Science (A.S.), Certificate Programs, and a Microcredential in Cybersecurity. More than 800 course sections are taught online, including academic programs that allow students to earn a degree or certificate entirely online.

More than 3,270 faculty and staff members work at BMCC bringing quality education to a diverse, urban population of students. BMCC has over 550 full-time tenure and tenuretrack faculty, teaching in over 200 subject areas.

BMCC is fully accredited by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education and offers over 60 associate degree programs through 19 academic departments, as well as certificates and micro-credentials created with industry partners. Over 90% of the degrees BMCC awards are associate degrees.

BMCC also offers a variety of Success Programs to help students develop beyond their academic degree requirements, including areas such as Leadership, College Readiness, and more.

THE STUDENTS

Serving 21,000 matriculated students, and 10,000 continuing education students, BMCC welcomes everyone from recent high school graduates to seasoned professionals, all seeking intellectual growth in a supportive learning community.

BMCC is a federally designated Hispanic Serving Institution (H.S.I.), Asian American and Native American Pacific Islander-Serving Institution (AANAPISI) and thus a Minority Serving Institution (M.S.I.). The diverse student population is 44% Hispanic or Latino, 25% Black or African American, 12% Asian, 10% White, and 3% two or more races. Some 57% are women. Over 30% of BMCC students were born outside the U.S., representing more than 105 countries and 59 languages. More than half of our students (58%) are the first in their families to attend college. More than eight in 10 (82%) of incoming freshmen arrive from New York City public high schools.

BMCC is firm in its commitment to breaking barriers to education, ensuring that every student has the tools and support they need to achieve their dreams. A significant





proportion of students struggle to meet basic needs: 74% of our first-time, full-time students and 56% of all BMCC students receive Pell grants, an indicator of low income. Nearly seven in every 10 BMCC students experience some combination of housing insecurity, food insecurity and/or homelessness. BMCC supports student success through cohort programs, supplemental instruction, peer mentoring, tutoring, and proactive advisement, as well as emergency food distribution, crisis intervention, emergency financial assistance, and dormitory housing.

There are nearly 85,000 BMCC alumni across the nation and around the world!

THE CAMPUS

BMCC offers convenient campuses in vibrant locations that enhance the college experience, including the main campus in downtown Manhattan, and a satellite campus uptown at CUNY in The Heights. BMCC provides state-of-the-art facilities with modern classrooms, specialized labs, a competitive-size swimming pool and student-centric spaces. The Conference Center and Events Spaces serve as dynamic venues for academic conferences, community events, and professional gatherings, fostering collaboration and innovation within and beyond our campus community. An overview of the spaces comprise the BMCC Campus includes:

MAIN CAMPUS

Located in the heart of downtown NYC, the main campus of the College is situated on 4.28 acres of land in a building that was designed with the Hudson River harbor in mind — shaped like a ship with its helm pointed to sea. Spanning four blocks from Chambers Street to North Moore Street, it's equivalent to the Empire State Building lying on its side; it is the hub of life at the College. Students actively participate in the artistic communities of Tribeca and SoHo, the dynamic downtown financial district, and the center of New York City government at City Hall.

Murray Street

BMCC currently occupies space on the 2nd, 10th, 11th and 14th floors of 70 Murray Street. The Murray building includes modern smart classrooms, computer labs, conference rooms, a student lounge, printing/copying facilities and gender-neutral restrooms, as well as, a respite room, which provides a nurturing, private space for lactating parents. BMCC Express is located on the street level of the 70 Murray Street building, to welcome students and the general public who wish to obtain information about the College.

Fiterman Hall

The Miles and Shirley Fiterman Hall is a 15-story academic facility that houses an art gallery, 65 classrooms, 35 computer labs, 130 offices for faculty, library spaces, atriums, open stairways, and several large assembly and performance rooms including a conference center on the top two floors and a double high choral ensemble space.

Center for Continuing Education & Workforce Development

BMCC's Continuing Education and Workforce Development programs operate at the 44,000 sq. ft. space steps away from Wall Street and Bowling Green. BMCC offers over 300 online certificate programs and personal development courses in traditional classroom style formats, as on-line offerings or corporate on-site training opportunities.

CUNY in The Heights (CITH)

The 30,000 sq. ft space located in the Inwood section of Manhattan includes an open student lounge with access to natural light, a quiet study area, and state-of-the-art flexible classrooms. Students who take classes at CITH can participate in a variety of Success Programs, including Accelerated Study in Associate Programs (ASAP) and Math Start to help them navigate their learning experience and earn their degree.

Manhattan Educational Opportunity Center (MEOC)

MEOC is in The Adam Clayton Powell, Jr. State Office Building, in the heart of Harlem. MEOC helps adult students learn English, earn an HSE diploma and prepare for college or receive training for a career that pays a sustainable wage.





LEADERSHIP AND ADMINISTRATION



Since assuming the presidency of BMCC in September 2020, President Anthony E. Munroe has spearheaded dynamic growth and innovation, focusing on building equity and inclusion, addressing student basic needs, and expanding academic and career opportunities for its diverse student body. His leadership has been marked by a firm commitment to fostering a supportive and empowering environment where all students can thrive. As a result of his advocacy for

equity in higher education, President Munroe was recognized by City & State as one of New York's most influential academic leaders and named to their 2023 Higher Education Power 100 list.

President Munroe is a first-generation U.S. citizen who grew up in the Bronx and attended NYC public schools. He holds a Master of Business Administration from the Kellogg Graduate School of Management at Northwestern University, and both a Master of Public Health and Doctorate in Education with a concentration in health education, from Columbia University, Teachers College.

The specific and detailed regulations that govern the operation of BMCC are the Bylaws of the Board of Trustees of The City University of New York.

Within the college, the Academic Senate and the College Council are the two legislative bodies of Borough of Manhattan Community College.

College Council

Recognizing the legislative authority of the Academic Senate in matters of curriculum and degree requirements, the College Council shall be the body which establishes college policy on all matters except those specifically reserved by the laws of the State of New York, the Bylaws of the Board of Trustees of the City University of New York, and by the collective bargaining agreements in force.

Academic Senate

The Academic Senate is responsible for the principle academic policy decisions of the College including admissions criteria, academic programs, degree requirements, and graduation requirements. It is the agent of the faculty for carrying out the functions of faculty, according to the provisions of the By-laws of the Board of Trustees.

Professional Staff Congress

The Professional Staff Congress is the union that represents more than 27,000 faculty and staff at the City University of New York (CUNY) and the CUNY Research Foundation. It is dedicated to advancing the professional lives of its members, enhancing their terms and conditions of employment, and maintaining the strength of the nation's largest, oldest and most visible urban public university.

The Provost will lead the development and execution of a strategic academic vision that advances equity, excellence in teaching and learning, and student success. This includes leveraging data to inform decisions, aligning academic programs with workforce needs, and fostering a culture of innovation and continuous improvement.

The ideal candidate will be a high-energy change agent with a demonstrated ability to lead strategic transformation, tackle complex issues with urgency, and build trust across diverse constituencies.

In addition, the successful candidate will:

- Enhance the College's academic and research reputation, impact, and reach by providing strategic leadership and academic direction aligned with the mission of the College and the University.
- Provide academic and strategic leadership, direction, and policy formulation for all academic divisions and programs.
